- Multiple assessments will be conducted throughout the year
- The student has **to** appear for **each** of the periodic tests, Mid-Term Examination and End Term Exams.
- Marks of Internal assessment will be added to the Mid-term Examination and End-Term Examination.
- End-Term Examination will be based on the complete syllabus of Class IX.
- If a student misses any test/ examination he/she will be awarded **ZERO** for the same.
- **NO RETEST** will be allowed, under any circumstance, except if the student is representing the school in sports.

2. Pass Criteria

- In order to be declared as having passed Class IX Examination, a student **must obtain a minimum of 33% marks** in **both** the Internal Assessment **and** the Final Examination and in each of the five subjects individually.
- If a student scores less than 33% in two subjects, it will be considered as compartment, and he/she will have to write the compartment exam and score a minimum of 33% for promotion to Class X.
- If a student scores less than 33% in **more** than two subjects, he/she will be considered detained in Class IX.

3. Co-Scholastic Assessment

- Co-Scholastic assessment will be based on a five point grading scale which will include Art Education and Health and Physical Education. Health and Physical Education will include assessment in individual games, group games, physical exercises and a component of Social Empowerment through Work Education and Action.

4. Discipline

- This will be assessed along with Co-Scholastic assessment on a five point grading scale based on attendance, sincerity, behaviour and values.

- The student has **to** appear for **each** of the periodic tests, Mid-Term Examination, Revision Tests Series and Pre-Board Examination.
- End Term Examination will be based on the complete syllabus of Class X and will be conducted by CBSE.
- If a student misses any test/ examination he/she will be awarded ZERO for the same.
- **NO RETEST** will be allowed, under any circumstances, except if the student is representing the school in sports.

2. Pass Criteria

- In order to be declared as having passed Class X Examination, a student **must obtain a minimum of 33% marks** in **both** the Internal Assessment **and** the Board Examination and in each of the five subjects individually.
- If a student scores less than 33% in one subject, it will be considered as compartment, and he/she will have to write the compartment exam and score above 33% in it for promotion to Class XI. The exam will be conducted by CBSE.
- If a student scores less than 33% in two or more subjects, he/she will be considered detained in Class X.
- The End Term performance printed profile will be issued by CBSE in May 2020.

3. Co-Scholastic Assessment

- Co-Scholastic assessment will be based on a five point grading scale which will include Art Education and Health and Physical Education. Health and Physical Education will include assessment in individual games, group games, physical exercises and a component of Social Empowerment through Work Education and Action.

4. Discipline

- This will be assessed along with Co-Scholastic assessment on a five point grading scale based on attendance, sincerity, behaviour and values.

CLASSES XI& XII:

- Weightage:** The Class XI session has two terms. Each term shall have rounds of Unit Tests(UTs) and (Half Yearly & Annual Exam). Both terms carry equal weightage for class XI.
- Practical exam is conducted twice –one each in Half-yearly Exams & Final term Exams in the months of September & January- Februaryrespectively.
- The Class XII session has two terms. Each term shall have rounds of (FRIDAY) Weekly Tests, Unit Tests(UTs) and (Half Yearly & Annual Exam).The Pre-boards & final exams shall include the entire syllabus as prescribed by the board.The question paper shall be set according to the pattern prescribed by the board in all the examinations.
- Practical exams are conducted thrice – twice in school, one each in Half-yearly Exams & 1st Pre-Board in the months of September & December respectively and third in the Final External Exam in the months of January- February
- Syllabus: Portion covered in the respective term.**
- Promotion Policy: (For Class XI)**
- The qualifying marks in each subject of examination shall be 33%.
- However, in a subject involving practical work, a candidate must obtain 33% marks in the theory and 33% marks in the practical separately in addition to 33% marks in aggregate, in order to qualify in that subject.
- Compartment cases will be counted as failure up-to two subjects. Failure to pass in more than two subjects will count to be **FAILED not COMPARTMENT**. A student failing in two subjects will have to appear for Re-test in those two subjects. In order to qualify

that exam, he/she must score at least 33% marks. If not, he/she will be counted as **FAIL** and shall reappear in class XI.

NOTE:

- a. If any exam is shifted from the scheduled dates due to any unforeseen circumstances then it will be mandatory for all to follow changed as per given instructions and no application / excuse for any reason will be entertained for the same.
- b. If a student misses any test/ examination he/she will be awarded ZERO for the same.
- c. **NO RETEST** will be allowed, under any circumstance, except if the student is representing the school in sports.
- d. The Medical Certificate in case of Medical Leave should be submitted to school within 3 working days of joining the school along-with application from parents.
- e. A student will be eligible to appear for class XI and XII examination if and only if he/she has atleast 75% of attendance from the 1st month of commencing the classes of that academic year till 1st January (for Class XII) and till 15th January of that academic year in which the final examinations commence.
